Art / Music for K-4

Art Around the World \$175	P4 (Gr. 1-2) P5 (Gr. 2-4)	TBA
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Become an art explorer! Travel to different parts of the world, exploring 2-D and 3-D art forms such as printmaking, collage, painting, and mixed media. Our itinerary will include Central and South America, Asia, India, Africa, and Europe. Join the fun!

Art of Calligraphy \$175	P1 (Gr. 2-4) P2 (Gr. 2-4)	SHIRES
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Students can practice their penmanship skills while creating art! We will use special, colorful, felt-tipped pens called chisel-edged markers to produce great-looking letters. Activities get kids started with simple zigzags and then move on to small and large italics, gothic lettering, uncial, and Roman calligraphy. Children will enjoy using their new skills to write down favorite poems, fashion border designs, and create greeting cards and invitations. Great for fine motor skills and refining penmanship as well!

Art Travels & Dance 2-period block \$330	P4-5 (Gr. K-1)	CHEW / J. LOPEZ
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This is a 2-Period block class - Students will join Mrs. Chew for Art Travels. We'll travel around the world through the eyes of an artist! Students will learn about other cultures by looking at artwork from a variety of countries and then create their own versions of the art using a variety of materials and techniques. Dance with Ms. J. will introduce students to various dance styles such as jazz, ballet and contemporary dance while also encouraging improvisation and creativity. Class runs from 12:25pm - 2:35pm.

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Sculpt your student's creative mind in this project-based learning class. Students learn to knead, cut, pinch and chisel life into their sculptures. Through use of hands, tools and their own creativity, students will work with various types of clay, paint and other objects to create sandcastles, owls, a rose paperweight and unique works of art.

Students work in teams to design, build and program SPIKE Prime robots to complete team challenges, rescue missions, solve mazes, and FIRST LEGO League challenges. Using a coding language based on Scratch and STEAM learning, SPIKE Prime units help students build confidence and critical thinking skills while analyzing data and solving complex problems with real-world relevance. 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Science Olympiad is bigger and better this year! In the first half of summer school, we will explore how bridges and boomilevers are engineered. Students will learn about trusses and arches, as well as how to efficiently distribute force. Students will design and build their own bridges and boomilevers out of balsa wood and put it to a stress test using Science Olympiad specifications and rules. The second half of the class is all about flight. We will build gliders powered by rubber bands and bottle rockets that carry "egg-o-nauts" to the sky. Students will develop the skills necessary to design and compete in flight events at the Los Angeles County Science Olympiad competition. This class requires dedicated and serious students interested in learning how to build advanced models with wood, super glue, tissue and other materials.

Summer Robotics Academy \$340	P1-2 (Gr. 5-8) (2-period)	TULL
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Build and program your own robots at Summer Robotics Academy! Learn to build robots KIPR Robotics kits. Learn code to program your robots using a modified version of C. We will use math and science skills, and develop leadership, team building, critical thinking and creative problem solving, as we work on competition level projects. Returning students will continue to focus on programming using new sensors and cameras.

Realities of SPEF Summer School

SPEF Summer High School is open to students who have completed 8th Grade. SPEF Summer High School instruction is compressed into an extremely short period. Each Summer School day is roughly equivalent to one week of instruction during the regular school year. Classes will be covering extensive course material daily and homework will be assigned. Summer School classes require a serious commitment.

Attendance Policy

Attendance rules are not flexible and must be adhered to. In order to satisfy class requirements, students must be present and on time each day:

- Attendance will be taken at the start of each Period.
- Missing 1 period is 1 absence.
- Missing 1 Full Day is 2 absences.
- 3 tardies are equivalent to 1 absence.
- Students who acquire more than 3 absences (either 3 absences plus 1 tardy or 4 absences) in a class will be dropped with a failing grade.
- No absence will be permitted the last day of your class. Finals will not be adjusted.
- Illness and medical appointments are absences.
- Assigning make-up work for illness will be at the discretion of the teacher and the administration.

Withdrawal Policy

Once Summer School starts, to officially drop your student so there is no academic consequence or record of a course being attempted on your student's transcript, complete the **Withdrawal Form**.

- Reasons for student Withdrawal may include:
 - A student decided not to start a class.
 - A student decided not to continue a class.
 - A student has breached the attendance policy.
 - A student is struggling with the pace of Summer School and will complete their class during the regular year.
- Withdrawal forms can be submitted until **June 25 for classes that end on June 27**.
- Withdrawals can be submitted until **July 13 for classes that end July 14**.
- The Withdrawal Form will be available on the SPEF website.
- Failure to follow this procedure may result in a failing grade on your student's transcript.
- This action is final.**

HS Credit Recovery

For students who do not want to take Credit Recovery courses during the school year, associated costs for SPEF Summer credit recovery courses for current SPHS students will be covered by the one-time SPUSD Expanded Learning Opportunities Grant. Please select the SPHS option when registering. Here is more information:

- Credit/College Recovery Classes are for students who earned a "D" or "F" grade. "D" grades are adequate for High School graduation but are not recognized by colleges. Students who earned a "D" grade during the school year receive no units upon passing a Recovery class, but can show an improved grade on their transcript. Students who received an "F" grade receive 5 units per semester upon passing.
- For Non-SPHS out of district students, the cost is \$280/semester. Please select the Non-SPHS option.
- Certain classes can only be taken by Edgenuity curriculum.

Edgenuity (Online Classes)

If there is an in-class option, students are encouraged to take the in-class option. Classes may be offered online through the Edgenuity platform if there is not enough enrollment to run in-class instruction. Chemistry & Biology cannot be recovered by Edgenuity. Math and Language classes for Advanced Credit cannot be taken by Edgenuity.

The Edgenuity online class has the same rigorous curriculum as the regular class:

- Students must attend class daily as well as complete additional work at home in order to complete the course.
- The Attendance Policy applies until a class is completed. If you complete the course ahead of the end date, you don't need to keep attending Summer School.
- The system logs each student's daily activity, including the amount of time spent on the program. Student progress reports are emailed to parents each Sunday.
- Students can work at their own pace on coursework, however there is a minimum pace that is required to complete the class within Summer school.
- Each student is expected to start their class on June 12, unless registered for another SPEF class.
- There are no refunds if your student doesn't finish the class within the allotted Summer timeframe.
- **If your student needs to recover two semesters in Summer, your student will need to be on track to complete their first semester by June 27, before they will be permitted to start their second semester or class.**

Taking recovery classes during summer school is not required. Contact your student's counselor to discuss programming options.

Withhold Transfer of Grade

- SPEF Summer High School provides the SPHS Registrar with transcripts 2 weeks after the end of Summer School.
- Students may elect to withhold the transfer of grades to their SPHS transcript by submitting a **Request to Withhold Transfer of Grade**.
- A Request to Withhold a Grade from the SPHS transcript must be submitted by **July 21st** (within 7 days of completion of Summer school).
- The Withhold Transfer of Grade Form will be available on the SPEF website.
- No record of attempting the class will show on your SPHS transcript. The class will not be considered complete & no credit will be given.
- Please note that summer school grades are not rounded.

Summer High School -- Course Descriptions

BIOLOGY 1/2

Some of the major themes in biology are science as an investigation and inquiry, historical changes of organisms, genetic continuity, regulation and homeostasis, and biological basis of behavior. Several of the topics studied, such as photosynthesis and genetics, will be closely related to basic chemical processes. Recommended Preparation: An "A" or "B" in Math. If "C" grade is earned, Skills Mastery must be shown. This course satisfies graduation requirements as a life science course. This course meets the UC/CSU "D" – Laboratory Science requirement. Since this is an accelerated course, there is a pre-requisite "B" grade or better for the most recent science and math courses completed by the student. In Person On campus only.

***CHEMISTRY - HONORS

This course explores the foundations of chemistry and covers the same content as Chemistry 1/2 at a deeper level. This class covers the content from a first-year high school chemistry class that students are expected to master before starting AP Chemistry. Students create molecular and computational models through classroom and laboratory activities to describe macroscopic phenomena. Topics include: atomic structure, bonding, states of matter, solutions, chemical reactions, kinetics, and equilibrium. Students are expected to have strong math (algebra) and problem solving skills and have successfully completed lab science classes. Since this is an accelerated course, there is a pre-requisite "B" grade or better for the most recent science and math courses completed by the student. In Person On campus only.

DRIVER'S EDUCATION

This class is offered in a twelve-day session with the CA State standard of an online certification program. It is designed to develop knowledge of the provisions of the CA Vehicle Code and other laws relating to the operation of motor vehicles and personal responsibility in traffic. This course will acquaint students with driving techniques and strategies that prepare them to become safe, responsible drivers, including knowledge of the dangers involved in consuming alcohol or drugs in connection with the operation of a motor vehicle. Students can take a practice exam in class. This course meets the requirement of the Department of Motor Vehicles of 30 hours of online instruction. Upon completion of this course, the student will receive DMV form #387 (Certificate of Completion of Classroom Driver Education - valid for one year from date of issuance) to allow them to take the DMV written exam to obtain a learner's permit. If a student reaches the minimum age of 15.5 while the certificate is still valid, they may use the certificate to apply for a learner's permit. Students who pass this course may be able to secure a driver's license prior to their 18th birthday. Classes will run June 12 – June 27. Students will need to attend class until 30 hours are completed and final test passed.
